Alt Park, Huyton (Page Moss ward)	3.65	71%	0	71%	This park has very low community use, and does not host any community events or organised sporting activities. The play area will remain and a new public open space just 10 minutes walk away is being developed at Hillside – this will include new play provision. There are also lots of alternative venues for sporting activities nearby - at Woolfall Heath Playing Fields (opposite the site) Lord Derby Playing Fields, Huyton KGV and Jubilee Park.
Broad Lane Playing Fields (Northwood ward)	3.02	100%	0	100%	This is a former school site with very low community use. It does not host any events. Webster Park and Memorial Park are both within 10 mins walk from this site and there are local sporting facilities at Eddie McArdle Playing Fields, which are due for improvements soon, as well as 3G pitches at Kirkby Leisure Centre and All Saints High School due for installation.
Copthorne Walk, Kirkby (Whitefield ward)	3.35	100%	0	100%	The community centre and play area are not included in the land for surrender. The other part of the site does not host community events or sporting activities and the site is adjacent to Copthorne Woods. There are community sports pitches at Kirkby High School and Bluebell School as well as a new 3G playing pitch at Kirkby Leisure Centre.
Court Hey Park, Huyton (Roby ward)	14	34%	0	34%	66% of the site will be retained including the play areas, bowling green, path network, sunken garden and Gladstone Fields. The site is just 800m from Bowring Park, which is currently undergoing a £2.6m transformation, and is also close to the Trans Pennine Trail (which runs through a number of green spaces). There are plans for Whitefield Cricket Club to be re-homed on the site or at an alternative location (a contribution will be sought from the developer to fund this). Any development will seek to protect natural habitats.
Cowper Way, Huyton	1.6	100%	0	100%	There is currently a very low level of community or sporting use. McGoldrick Park and Sawpit Park (both Green Flag Sites) are both

Field Lane, Kirkby (Cherryfield ward)	1.22	100%	0	100%	This site has been adversely affected by anti-social behaviour in recent years, with residents requesting a number of entry points be closed. Community events are hosted at the nearby Mill Dam Park, whilst sports pitches are available at Kirkby High School, Bluebell School and Kirkby Leisure Centre.
Finch Wood, Halewood (Halewood South ward)	3.96	100%	0	100%	There is limited public access to this site, and low levels of community use. Halewood Leisure Centre is opposite the site and provides a range of outdoor sporting activities. The new Oakfield Development will also create new green space locally and a developer contribution will be sought to further improve this.
Frederick Lunt Playing Fields, Halewood (Halewood North ward)	3.84	100%	0	100%	The fields do not host any community events or activities. It is used by a local football team but alternative provision is available at Arncliffe Playing Fields - 800 metres away - and Halewood Leisure Centre which is also nearby. Other sites, such as Halewood Doorstep Green could be developed to accommodate future sporting activities.
Grace Park, Halewood (Halewood South ward)	4.58	100%	0	100%	Greengates Playing Fields border this site; Halewood Leisure Centre is within 800 metres and just a 10 minute walk away. Any development would include good quality landscaping.
Halewood Doorstep Green (Halewood South ward)	14.85	42%	0	42%	The area identified for release requires significant improvements; the sections of the site with the higher levels of community use (i.e. the play areas / cycle routes etc) will be retained. Greengates Playing Fields, Halewood Leisure Centre, the community pitches at Halewood Academy and Arncliffe Playing Fields are within 1,200m. Developer contributions could be used to create sporting facilities on the site.
KGV Playing fields, Prescot	6.95	100%	1	86%	A new green space (including new play provision and a cycle link into Stadt Moers Park) will be created at Prescot Park, which is within 800 metres. Any new housing development would also create new green space (approx 1 hectare). Carr Lane Woods is opposite the site and

(Prescot North ward)					there are also nearby sporting hubs, including KGV playing fields in Huyton, the community pitches at Prescot High School, Prescot Soccer Centre, Two Butt Playing Fields and Windy Arbour Playing Fields. Developer contributions could be used to enhance the sporting offer at these sites.
Pool Hey Playing Fields (Stockbridge ward)	13.07	100%	1	92%	Any new housing development would create new green space (approx 1 hectare). There are existing playing pitches at Lord Derby Academy, Woolfall Heath and Knowsley Community College, which are all in close proximity. Developer contributions could be used to develop these sites to enhance the local sporting offer.
Roby Playing Fields, Huyton (Swanside ward)	5.8	100%	1	82%	This is not a well-used site, with limited community facilities. A developer would need to create a new green space (of approx 0.75 hectares). Jubilee Park (Green Flag site) and Bowring Park are both within 800 metres walk. Jubilee Park (home of Huyton Juniors Football Club), KGV playing fields in Huyton, Lord Derby Academy community playing pitches and Woolfall Heath Playing Pitch are all in close proximity. Developer contributions could be used to enhance the sporting offer at these sites. The existing Community Centre is not included in the land for surrender.
Spring Wood, Huyton (St Gabriel's ward)	2.64	100%	0	100%	This is not a particularly well used site, with limited community facilities. McGoldrick Park, Ten Acre Pits and Sawpit Park (all Green Flag sites) are all in close proximity. Tree planting (2 for 1 ratio) would be required as part of any future development.
St John's Millenium Green, Huyton (St Gabriel's ward)	2.16	100%	0	100%	There are relatively low levels of community use of this site, and it does not host any regular community events. McGoldrick Park and Sawpit Park (both Green Flag sites) are within 800 metres/10 minute walk. Local sporting hubs include KGV Playing Fields and Lord Derby Academy.
Syders Grove, Knowsley	5.52	16%	0	16%	There are relatively low levels of community use and this site does not host any regular community events. Knowsley Recreation, Shop Road Woods, Mill Lane Playing Fields are all within 800 metres/10 minutes

Westview, Huyton (St Gabriel's ward)	1.11	100%	0	100%	There are relatively low levels of community use and this site does not host any regular community events. Stadt Moers and Sawpit Park (Green Flag sites) are both within 800 metres/10 minutes' walk. Local playing fields / pitches are at KGV Huyton and Lord Derby Academy. New sporting provision could be developed on Stadt Moers (Westview) using developer contributions.
